Administrative Charging Committee-"ON COMPLETION OF AN INVESTIGATION OF A COMPLAINT MADE BY A MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC AGAINST A POLICE OFFICER, THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY SHALL FOARWARD TO THE APPROPRIATE ADMINISTRATIVE CHARGING COMMITTEE THE INVESTIGATORY FILES FOR THE MATTER. THE ADMINISTRATIVE CHARGING COMMITTEE SHALL REVIEW THE FINDING OF A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY'S INVESTIGATION CONDUCTED AND MAE A DETERMINATION THAT THE POICE OFFICER WHO IS SUBJECT TO INVESTIGATION SHLL BE ADMINISTRATIVELY CHARGED; OR NOT ADMINISTRATIVELY CHARGE.
