ADMINISTRATIVE SESSION

The Administrative Session was opened at 3:00 P.M.

- Cheryl DeBerry, Natural Resources Business Specialist, Garrett County Department of Economic Development, presented an update on her review of the *Bee City USA* County Designation. There are currently a number of activities that support the bee population. Garrett County Department of Public Works – Roads Division works closely with the Maryland Department of Natural Resources to preserve native plants when mowing and the University of Maryland Cooperative Extension provides educational programs concerning bees. Ms. DeBerry will help to coordinate additional educational outreach programs.
- 2. Brian Bowers, Purchasing Agent, Garrett County Purchasing Department, provided the Board of County Commissioners with a list of Garrett County Government vehicles and equipment recommending that these be designated as surplus and sold on govdeals.com. The Board of County Commissioners, on a motion by Commissioner Hinebaugh, which was seconded by Commissioner Tichnell, and made unanimous by Chairman Edwards, approved the vehicles and equipment as surplus and authorized the sale.

- 7. Board of County Commissioners Comments: Kirwan Commission Proposal
 - Chairman Edwards stated that the Board of County Commissioners is concerned with the cost
 of the Kirwan Commission proposal. Based upon the numbers available, there could
 possibility be an increase in property taxes by .25 cents just for Kirwan. Commissioner
 Hinebaugh stated that the proposal will cost the County an additional \$1.2 million per year \$12.5 million by 2030 this does not include school construction projects.
 - The Board of County Commissioners plan to hold community meetings to educate the public on the potential cost of the Kirwan proposal and the impact on Garrett County.
 - Senator Edwards and Delegate Beitzel stated that they are working to revise the school construction formula and there was no chance of the wealth formula being changed.

GARRETT COUNTY 2020 ALCOHOL LEGISLATIVE REQUESTS

AMEND - strike out election day

AB § 21-402. Hours and days of sale or delivery

A holder of a manufacturer's license may sell or deliver alcoholic beverages to a holder of a retail license from 6 a.m. to midnight on every day except Sunday or an election day.

AMEND – add or equivalent license in another jurisdiction

AB § 21-804. Class BDR beer and wine license

- (a) Established. -- There is a Class BDR (deluxe restaurant) beer and wine license.
- (b) Authorized holder. -- The license may be issued to a holder of a Class B beer license, or a Class B beer and wine license or EQUIVALENT LICENSES ISSUED BY DIFFERENT LOCAL LICENSING BOARDS ONLY FOR RESTAURANTS.

AMEND — add or equivalent license in another jurisdiction / change seating requirement

AB § 21-903. Class BDR beer, wine, and liquor license

- (a) Established. -- There is a Class BDR (deluxe restaurant) beer, wine, and liquor license.
- (b) Authorized holder. -- The Board may issue the license to a holder of:
- (1) a Class B beer and wine license;
- (2) a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license; er
- (3) a Class B Resort beer, wine, and liquor license; OR
- (4) EQUIVALENT LICENSES ISSUED BY DIFFERENT LOCAL LICENSING BOARDS ONLY FOR RESTAURANTS.
- (c) Scope of authorization. --
- (1) The Board may issue the license for use by a deluxe restaurant as defined by the Board with:
- (i) seating at tables, not including seats at bars or counters, for at least 85 20 individuals; and

CREATE - Wine Growler Permit like the Draft Beer Growler Permit AB § 21-1104 AB § Title 21 - Subtitle 11 - Additional License Privileges

Proposal to create language in the Alcoholic Beverages Article to establish and set a fee for Wine Growler Permit. THE BOARD MAY ISSUE A REFILLABLE CONTAINER PERMIT FOR WINE TO A HOLDER OF A LICENSE THAT ENTITLES THE HOLDER TO SELL WINE FOR OFF-PREMISES CONSUMPTION. FEES FOR THE ANNUAL PERMIT WILL BE \$75. THE BOARD SHALL CHARGE A ONE-TIME ISSUING FEE FOR A NEW PERMIT IN AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE ANNUAL PERMIT FEE. (exact bill language will be drafted by the Legislative Services Office)

CREATE - On-Site Consumption Permit for Class 1 Distillery AB § Title 21 - Subtitle 4 - Manufacturer's License

Proposal to create language in the Alcoholic Beverages Article to establish and set a fee for an On-Site Consumption Permit for a Class 1 Distillery. This was a result of HB 549 last session that authorizes a local licensing board to grant an on-site consumption permit for use at the location of the Class 1 Distillery. THE PERMIT AUTHORIZES THE PERMIT HOLDER TO SELL MIXED DRINKS MADE FROM LIQUOR THAT THE HOLDER PRODUCES THAT IS MIXED WITH OTHER NONALCOHOLIC INGREDIENTS FOR ON-PREMISES CONSUMPTION AT THE LOCATION OF THE CLASS 1 DISTILLERY. (exact bill language will be drafted by the Legislative Services Office

Request legislation to be effective July 1, 2020.

2020 LEGISLATIVE REQUEST BOARD OF GARRETT COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

1. A request by the Board of County Commissioners that the Delegation introduce legislation in Maryland General Assembly to provide the Board with enabling authority to amend provisions of Section 14-603, et seq., of the Maryland Tax-Property Code authorizing the Board of County Commissioners of Garrett County, Maryland to impose a rate of interest for each month or fraction of a month that the county or municipal corporation property tax or taxing district property tax is overdue to 1.50%.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 14-603 of the State Code, Garrett County may not charge an interest rate greater than one (1) percent (1%).

The Board is requesting enabling legislation to allow the Board of County Commissioners to increase the interest rate for unpaid property tax bills to 1.50% percent.
